Observations

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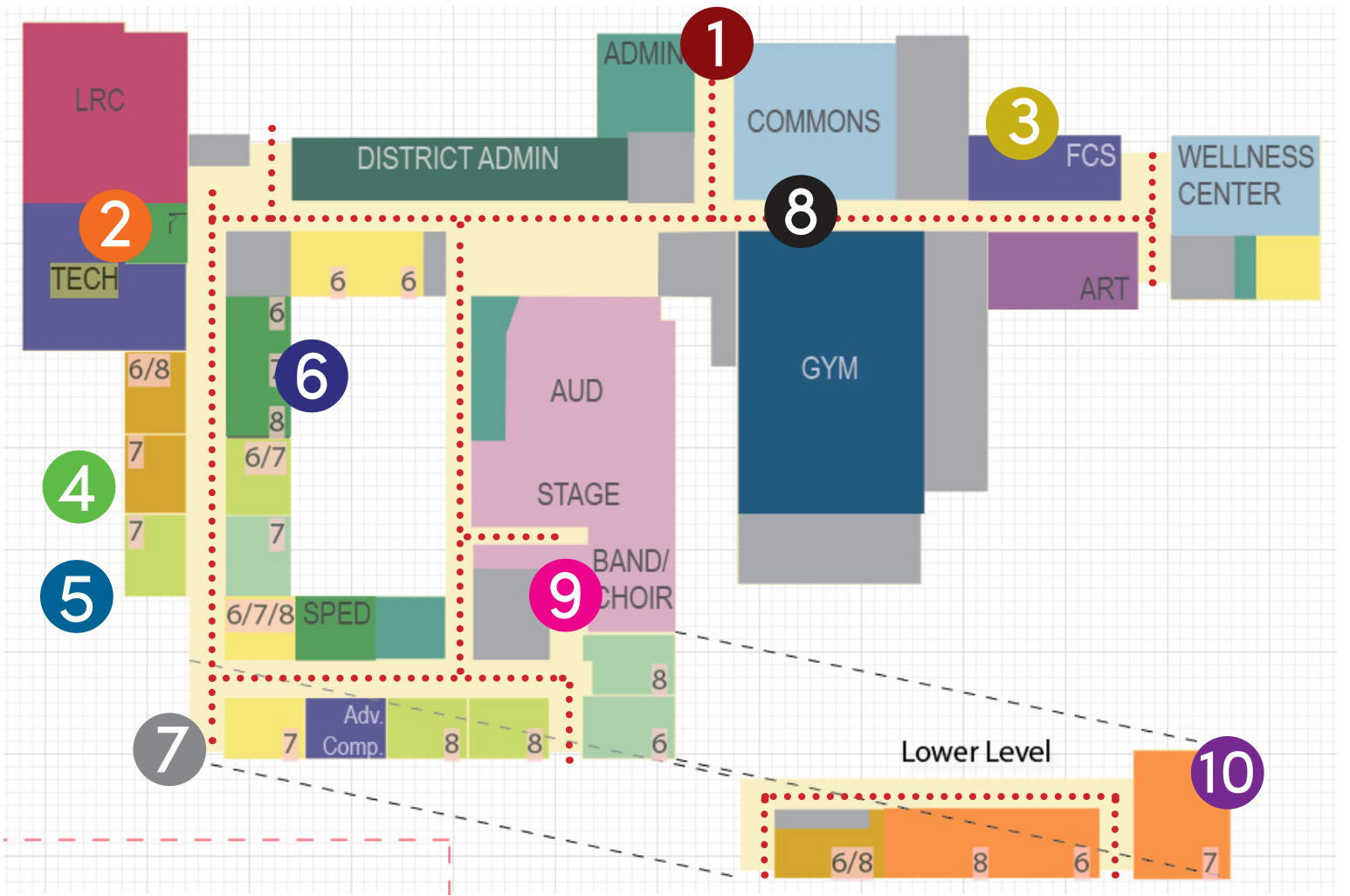
Exterior

District staff and/or Vision 202 participants identified the following positive **exterior** features of Lisle Junior High School:

- Clear entrance located at the front of the building
- Wilde Field on site
- Plenty of green space
- Centrally located

The following challenges were also noted for the Lisle Junior High School **exterior** and/or site grounds:

- 1 Limited parking during events
- 2 Traffic congestion in the front circle during drop-off/pick-up
- 3 Lack of a dedicated bus lane obstructs traffic flow on the street, space in the bus lane is not sufficient for all the buses to line up
- 4 Underutilized courtyard space
- 5 Potential confusion between the Junior High and the District Office entrances
- 6 Track at Wilde Field is in need of repairs
- 7 Pressbox access & repair at Wilde Field



Observations

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Interior

We are proud of the bright, safe environment the Jr. High offers the students with access to amenities and opportunities to support student growth.

District staff and/or Vision 202 participants identified the following positive **interior** features of Lisle Jr. High School:

- Auditorium
- Gym
- Wellness Center
- Commons

The following challenges were also noted for the Lisle Jr. High School building **interior**:

- 1 Main Entrance lacks a secure vestibule into the main office
- 2 Student services office space is shared impacting confidentiality
- 3 Limited and inflexible space in Family/Consumer Sciences (FCS)
- 4 Limited classroom space to accommodate the number of class offerings and/or sections
- 5 Lack of collaborative spaces for teachers and students
- 6 Small special services classroom and offices
- 7 Stairs are not usable when the lift is in operation. When the lift is not operational, students with physical challenges are unable to attend classes on the lower level
- 8 Indoor practice space is limited for activities and sports
- 9 Undersized band/chorus room with accessibility challenges for students with disabilities
- 10 Heating/cooling units in some classrooms are loud and impact student participation
